



THE KING'S ACADEMY TUITION ASSISTANCE POLICY

I. Commitment to Access and Mission Alignment

The King's Academy is committed to providing access to a Christ centered, college preparatory education for students from a variety of backgrounds. Tuition assistance is an important expression of this commitment, helping ensure that students who are a strong mission fit have the opportunity to be known, loved, and equipped to flourish within our community.

II. Purpose of Tuition Assistance at TKA

Tuition assistance is used strategically to advance the mission and long term health of the school in the following ways:

a. Enrollment Stewardship

Tuition assistance supports the enrollment of mission aligned students while contributing to the overall sustainability of the school.

b. Community Impact

Tuition assistance allows a broader range of students to experience a TKA education, strengthening both the life of the school and the impact of our graduates beyond it.

c. Community and Belonging

Tuition assistance supports the development of a student body that reflects the breadth of God's kingdom and enriches the relational and spiritual life of the school.

III. Governance and Oversight

In stewarding tuition assistance, the Head of School and senior leadership establish procedures aligned with best practices in Christian and independent school education, including those reflected by ACSI and SAIS, and guided by principles of faithful stewardship, access, and long term sustainability. The Board of Trustees provides annual oversight and review of tuition assistance philosophy and practice to ensure alignment with mission and financial health.

IV. Procedures for Awarding Tuition Assistance

- a. Admission to The King's Academy is not based on financial need.
- b. Tuition assistance is awarded only to students who have been fully admitted and have completed all required admissions and tuition assistance application materials through the FACTS platform.
- c. Families must apply for tuition assistance annually.
- d. The Tuition Assistance Committee, consisting of representatives from Admissions, the Business Office, and senior leadership, reviews all applications.
- e. Awards are determined based on demonstrated financial need as calculated through FACTS and informed by the school's internal review of each family's circumstances, as well as the overall enrollment, financial, and programmatic considerations of the grade, division, and school.
- f. Tuition assistance decisions are made independent of a student's participation in specific programs or areas of school life beyond general admissibility.
- g. Awards typically represent a portion of demonstrated need, with the expectation that families contribute meaningfully to the cost of a TKA education.
- h. The school does not typically meet full demonstrated financial need.
